SEARCH WARRANT IS HELD INVALID

Judge Cochran Orders Whisky and Money Returned to Distillery Owners.

Frankfort, March 15. — Judge A. M. J. Cochran in the Federal Court Tuesday ordered the return of 159 cases of whisky and \$12,720 in money to M. E. Hughes and W. R. Carey, holding that a search warrant used by Sam Collins, State Prohibition Director, was invalid.

Judge Cochran refused to quash the indictment against the men and their trials will be called tomorrow morning. A continuance will be asked if it was said. Federal agents are anxious to have the case come to trial, it was said, to clear certain points. It is regarded as a test case.

In his ruling, Judge Cochran said the search warrant was not specific as to the property sought and the premises to be searched.

The whisky was removed from the Belle of Anderson Distillery, fifteen miles from here, six months ago without a permit. It is charged. Hughes and Carey purchased the distillery prior to that time.

Mr. Collins, after obtaining a warrant, found the whisky loaded on trucks, and the money secreted in a bed at the residence occupied by the men, he said.

This led to the arrest of Hughes, Carey, C. E. Finn, Ernest Griffey, Joseph Sanders, Charles Shultz, John Ehrlich and Fred and Walter Atking.

The report of the superintendent of City Mission for the month of February follows: Visitors at Mission 165; visits to the homes 52; visit to sick 20. Made new garments 4; remodeled old garments 23. Superintendent wove 12 yards carpet; two girls wove 2 yards carpet. Superintendent delivered bread to 11 families (two bakeries furnished the bread); food provided by city to 1 family; shoes furnished by city to 2 boys. Clothing given out 125 garments; shoes given out 18 pairs; hats given out 18. Friends donated clothing 110 garments. Attendance at prayer meeting 22; attendance at Sunday school 258.
