**Proposed Amendment to the Con-
stitution.**
THE STATE OF OHIO,
OFFICE OF THE SECRETARY OF STATE,
I, William Henry Smith, Secretary of State
of the State of Ohio, do hereby certify that the
following is a true copy of a joint resolution,
passed by the General Assembly of the State
of Ohio, on the 6th day of April, A. D. 1887,
taken from the original rolls on file in this
office.
In testimony whereof I have hereunto sub-
scribed my name and affixed the Great Seal of
the State of Ohio, at Columbus, Ohio, this
6th day of April, A. D. 1887.

Resolution.
Relative to an amendment of the Constitu-
tion providing for the extension of the
elective franchise.
Resolved by the General Assembly of the
State of Ohio, (three-fifths of the mem-
bers elected to each House agreeing there-
to) That it be and is hereby proposed to
the electors of this State to vote, at the next
regular election, upon the approval or re-
jection of the following amendment of the
Constitution of this State, to wit: Every
male citizen of the United States, of the
age of twenty-one years, who shall have
been a resident of the State one year next
preceding the election, and of the county,
township or ward in which he resides, such
time as may be provided by law, except such
persons as have borne arms in support of any
insurrection or rebellion against the govern-
ment of the United States, or have fled from
their places of residence to avoid being draft-
ed into the military service thereof, or have
deserted the military or naval service of said
government in time of war, and have not sub-
sequently been honorably discharged from the
same, shall have the qualifications of an
elector, and be entitled to vote at all elections.
