Testing Seed-Corn.

In consequence of the rainy season many persons have doubted whether the corn of last year would germinate good when we come to plant it in the Spring. My corn which is designed for seed was stored in a loft, and I have lately tested its goodness for seed in the following manner: I picked out, promiscuously, one dozen ears, and then broke them in the middle. I then took three grains from the middle portion of the ear, and planted them in two inverted saucers, out of six inches square, filling the inverted saucers with hot water. The two saucers were then placed with the grass seeds together, in a basin and kept in a warm place near a fire in the room. In forty-eight hours I examined them. Out of thirty-six grains planted, thirty five had thrown out sprouts an inch long.
