Ed SPIRIT: I feel in duty bound to reply to the article in the Gazette of last issue in regard to the carrying of the mail.

When I came on the line I was notified by the road management that there was soon to be a change; that the mail was to be sent out of Bellaire in the morning instead of Woodfield.

I received a further order from the President of the road to make the change on May 1st.

Since then the trouble has been in Woodfield alone. It is alleged that the mail, as carried now, is for my convenience.

I would say to the editor of the Gazette that I have a petition signed by every P. M. along the line in favor of the mail as carried now, and I would also refer him to a letter written by P. M. at Bellaire to the President of the road on this subject.

As to the C. & P. and east bound B. & O. mail laying in Bellaire, if the road management will order the conductor of train No. 1 to carry a special pouch of the mail, and the P. M. at this place will receive it, it will be to your honor.

Yours P. M. here has a letter from the P. M. at Bellaire to that effect. If the gentleman will make inquiry he will learn that his "Wheeling papers" will be delivered to him, after the 23rd inst., on the morning train.

This dissatisfaction exists wholly in Woodfield, and the gentleman must allow that there are other offices along the line, and in Monroe County, that are opposed to any change; but I suppose that in the face of the petition, and the voice of the people, and the letters written by other P. M.'s, that the gentleman will still insist on the mail being carried for my convenience and contrary to the will of the people.

A FEARFUL ACCIDENT—At Harrietsville, on the 7th, occurred a fearful accident by which Charles, a ten-year-old son of Herman Kirchner, lost his life.

It seems that the boy in Harrietsville had been in the habit of going to the saw-mill run by water-power, and while one would perch himself on the "bull-wheel" on which the rope was wound up, when drawing logs to the mill, another would run on the water and send the wheel spinning around with its occupant riding on top.

Young Kirchner, and a companion about the same age, went to the mill last Saturday morning about 7 o'clock, and took a position on the wheel, while his companion turned on the water. As there was a heavy load of water, the wheel spun round and round at a rapid rate, and the limbs of the lad were thrown over the side of the wheel and caught between a wire rope stretched across a corner of the mill, and the partition wall. The lad fell that he was slipping off, held on to the rope with his hands, and the result was that his leg was broken in two places below the knee, and the flesh and muscles of the limbs between the ankle and knee-joint completely torn off; the knee-joint was dislocated, and the thigh-bone broken loose at the joint.

The thigh completely stripped from the bone to within a few inches of the hip-joint. Drs. Krupp of Caldwell, Harl of Dexter, and Biskop of Salem, were summoned, and agreed with Dr. Martin, that amputation was the only hope, and eight hours after the accident the little sufferer's limb was amputated at the upper third of the thigh, but no action never set in, and the mutilated lad, died at one o'clock, on Sunday morning.

The physicians deserve great credit for their efforts to save the boy's life, but as expected their efforts were vain.—Noble County Republican, 13th inst.

JACOB RUFF, of Switzerland township, was committed to jail on the 13th inst., charged with threatening to beat and injure MICHAEL LAPP of the same township.

RUFF was taken before the Probate Court on a writ of habeas corpus and after a hearing was released, because the Constable had not certified that the mittimus was a correct copy of the original.

A hearing was had before Governor Foster last week on the petition and papers for the commutation of the sentence of FERRIS KING, Jr., from hanging to imprisonment for life. To this writing no intelligence has been received here in relation to the matter. KING is under sentence to be hanged on Friday, the 28th inst. He appears as lively and cheerful as either of his three companions in the jail.

Two passenger trains will be placed on B. & O. Railroad on the 23d of this month. These will be fast trains and will stop only at Newark, Zanesville, Cambridge, Barnevillle and Bellaire on the C. O. Section 3,374 of the Revised Statutes reads: "A company operating a railroad, in whole or in part, in this State, may demand and receive for transportation of passengers on its road not exceeding three cents per mile, for a distance of more than eight miles, but the fare shall always be made that multiple of five nearest reached by multiplying the rate by the distance."

That is very plain, and no rule adopted by any Company in Ohio requiring passengers, who fail to procure tickets, to pay a sum greater than that demanded at an office of the Company, for the distance, will stand for a moment against the law.

Action on the Pennsylvania Contested Election.

WASHINGTON, May 11.—The contested election case of Curtin against Yocum was decided to-day in the House against Curtin, the democratic contestant, by a large majority, a good many democrats voting against unseating the republican Yocum.
