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GOV. HOADLY'S INAUGURAL ADDRESS.

Gentlemen of the Senate and House of Representatives: In accordance with law, I am here to take the oath, and enter upon the discharge of the duties of the office of Governor.

The elections held in October, 1882, and 1883, consummated by the changes in office made to-day reverse the character of political control in all departments of the State Government.

Extensive changes in the Judicial Department have been authorized by constitutional amendment. With the aid of the bar from whom this measure emanated, and whose general support has given it public confidence.

In this connection, I may add that the Hamilton County Fee bill, adopted in 1870, has been for thirteen years in successful operation, and that its principle might be applied to others, at least of the more populous and wealthy counties.

It is to be regretted that public attention was not sufficiently alive in 1879 to its importance, to secure the adoption of the Constitutional amendments then submitted.
