New York, May 1.—Just as Monday, the city was astir early in the morning, and the streets were crowded and in almost impassable condition long before there was anything to see except the gaily decorated buildings and the increasing throngs of passers-by.

The scene at ten o'clock on Broadway and Park Row from the window of the Press-Nite Association was an inspiring one. The brightly decorated fronts of the post-office and Astor House furnished a background for the moving, bustling picture of a great city.

The last part of the parade passed the reviewing stand at 6:30 p. m. The president at once retired from the platform which he had occupied for so long. After a short interval of rest, he was driven to the Metropolitan opera house, where the banquet was given.
