The Falls Township Sunday School Convention will be held in the U. B. Church at Enterprise, Ohio, Sunday, August 26, 1906, at 1 o'clock p. m.

Hocking Valley to Charleston. From a reliable source it is learned that plans for extensive improvements on the through line from Columbus to Charleston, W. Va., and in the passenger service when the transfer of the Kanawha and Michigan to the Hocking Valley railway is made, have been adopted.

Among the improvements to be made will be the replacing and strengthening of the steel bridge over the Ohio river and the building of a 1600-foot tunnel at Langsville O. This will cut out an eight degree curve and will shorten the route materially.

When the improvements are completed a through limited passenger service is to be put on, and the time between Columbus and Charleston is to be shortened from 8 hours to 5 1-2 to 6 hours. The distance is 176 miles, and the passenger crews of the limited trains will run through from Columbus to Charleston.

A practical reorganization of the Hocking Valley will be necessary under the new condition, and two divisions will probably be formed with a superintendent in charge of each. Where this division will be made has not yet been decided.

It is learned that securities have been exchanged and all plans ready for the transfer of the Zanesville and Western from the Hocking Valley to the Ohio Central lines, and it is understood that the Zanesville and Western will also be absorbed and will lose its individual identity.
