Court Report.

The April term of the Court of Common Pleas, after a recess of three weeks, adjourned on Saturday. The following concludes the business transacted:

State of Ohio vs. Henry Bondy. Burglary. The defendant was a colored man. It appeared from the testimony that on the night of the 20th of February last he broke a large glass window in the drug store of George W. Swanson, at Cheshire, and going in carried off perfume, jewelry, cartridges, nickles, etc., which were afterwards found in his bed-room.

Clayton Cooper, by his next friend John C. Cooper, vs. John Leeper. Judgment for plaintiff for \$23.38 and costs.

State of Ohio vs. Lewis Hager. Assault with intent to kill. Verdict of jury, assault and battery. This case resulted out that the defendant had hit a girl, Delaware Iron, with a stove. He was fined \$20 and costs.

State of Ohio vs. Madison Miles and Zachariah Polly. Cutting with intent to wound. Miles tried; verdict guilty; nothing found against Polly. The defendants, in company with Thomas Burns, were on a wagon out beyond Halley Livesey's.

Francis M. Washburn vs. Jonathan Hamilton. Judgment for plaintiff for \$52.10.

Azariah Denny vs. George Denny. Appeal. This was a suit about a shotgun trade between the sons of the parties. Judgment for defendant for costs.

Marion J. Dewitt vs. Wm. and Sarah Lewis. Plaintiff dismissed his action.

Mary A. Ward et al. vs. Chas. W. Gee et al. Plaintiff dismissed her action; costs paid; no record.

T. S. & H. N. Ford vs. S. G. Keller. Settled as costs of defendant.

H. Z. Adams vs. George Howarth. Motion to amend sheriff. Plaintiff dismissed his action; sheriff to pay cost.

Thos. Sims & Co. vs. Robt. F. Hughes. Receiver's report confirmed.

Allan Viers vs. Anna Viers et al. This action was brought to set aside a deed made by John Viers to his son Andrew. The grounds alleged were that the old man Viers was unduly influenced to make the deed when he was incapable of contracting.

Leah Blessing vs. Jno. R. Blessing's adm'r et al. Court found that the support of the plaintiff is a charge and lien upon the land. The value of said charge fixed by the court at \$600.
