Ecclesiastical Bullies. Should The Pulpit Be Placed On A Level With The Circus?

Considerable stir has been created in the South by an episode which occurred in a Congregational Church in Nashville, Tennessee, a short time ago.

While one is not apt to go the theater for the best examples of morality, or the most ennobling influences, still the Church, as well as the world, can afford to be fair.

Another Republican vote of 563, cast for a Republican in Norfolk, and still another of 1,221, in Scott County, all Republican votes, cast for independent candidates, were found in the Democratic column.

As showing the depths of degradation to which the human family may fall, we quote the following dispatch from Columbia, South Carolina, concerning Stephen Bailey, recently arrested near that place:

"I have been married three times. I killed my first wife with a club. Her name was Catherine. I buried her in the garden, and after a while it was found out, and the people dug her up and buried her in the graveyard. She had six children for me. My second wife's name was Mary. I killed her with a brick by hitting her in the head. I will not tell what I did with her body. She had one child, a boy. His name is Sabej. I don't know where he is. My third wife's name was Sallie. She was unfaithful to me for a long time. My wife and I had not been on good terms for three or four weeks. That day I laid in wait for her in a footpath, and as she came along I hit her on the head with an axe and killed her, and dragged her into the bushes until that night. Then I sent my boy to the yard for a wheelbarrow, and when he came I sent him back to the house. Then I put the body into the wheelbarrow and carried it about a mile, and put it in the furnace. At sunrise I started the fire, and about 8 or 9 o'clock it was found out. Sallie had seven children."
