It is very desirable to have hens lay well in cold weather, when eggs brings a good price. To succeed in this is within reach of the eye, but a mixture is more satisfactory as an all-around fowl.

Last winter I had a flock of thirty-five hens, ranging from pullets to hens four years old. They were a mixed lot, some Plymouth Rocks, some large Langshans, a few Brahmans, and a goodly proportion of Brown Leghorns...

As there is more or less variation in the proportion of the ingredients, the taste of the user must decide which is best for him: One ounce salt to every pound of meat, an ounce saltpeter to 20 pounds meat, 5 pounds sugar to 100 pounds meat, water to cover.

For 100 pounds meat, 9 pounds salt, 3 ounces saltpeter, 3 pounds molasses, an ounce bicarbonate soda, 6 gallons water. Leave in pickle six weeks and smoke to taste, using fragrant woods.

Hamshire Bacon—In a shallow, wide tub put brine strong enough to float an egg. To each peck of salt add 2 ounces refined saltpeter and 1 to 2 pounds brown sugar or good molasses.
