



MEN WHO DRAW DOUBLE PAY.

From the Baltimore American. WASHINGTON, August 10.—The Post-office Department confronted with a curious case. A few weeks ago the name of a clerk was brought to the attention of First Assistant Postmaster General Heath as an applicant for an increase of salary. Mr. Heath investigated the case and found that the man was drawing a salary of \$1,000 per annum, but that the chief of his division wistfully endorsed his application for an increase, stating that the man was one of the hardest workers in his office, always at his desk, never missing a day for sickness or other cause, and that, in addition to his own work, he frequently helped out other clerks who were behind in their daily tasks. General Heath was about to order a substantial increase of salary. One day he was it formed that the industrious clerk, who never missed a day was carried on the pension roll as a totally disabled soldier, and was drawing a pension at the rate of \$72 per month. This is the highest pension paid under the law, and the pensioners who draw this sum make an affidavit that they are truly unable and helpless that they require the constant attendance of a nurse or other attendant to feed them, give them their medicine and in other ways minister to their every physical need. According to that clerk who on the pension roll was a physical wreck drawing \$72 per month, and on the post-office rolls as one of the best men in the service, drawing \$1,000 per year, received no promotion.

OTHER CASES.

General Heath found that this by no means an isolated case. Not long ago a man who had been in the postoffice service under Mr. Cleveland, and had been dismissed, applied for reinstatement on the ground that he was an old soldier. When he made his personal application he told how hard he had worked for the McKinley campaign, and he brought proof of untiring industry on election days. The department was favorably impressed. His soldier record was looked up, and it was found that he was drawing the pension of a totally disabled veteran, \$72. He was confronted with his pension record, and admitted it. He was told that he must either surrender his pension or withdraw his application for reinstatement, because the two were utterly inconsistent. He promptly withdrew his request for reinstatement, saying that since he had been turned out of office under Mr. Cleveland, he had been drawing this rate of pension, but had preferred his old job over the government.




