THE MINERS' GREAT STRIKE IN PENNSYLVANIA.

Troops Ordered to the Mines—One Man Killed and Many Injured.

FRIDAY'S SUMMARY. Governor Stone summoned to Harrisburg officers of the National Guard to confer as to the expediency of ordering out troops, in response to calls from Shenandoah and Potomac.

At Shenandoah a reign of terror prevailed. An armed mob clashed with officers, and 300 shots were exchanged. One man was killed and many injured.

Officials at Pottsville of the Reading Coal and Iron Company reached the conclusion that the only way to cope with the strikers is by the employment of troops.

President Mitchell, of the United Mine Workers, gave to the public a letter, in which he charges nine railroad companies with responsibility for the condition of the miners.

Fearful that the strike will result in riot and bloodshed, a number of foreigners, who were employed in the mines at Hazleton, left for their former homes.

The strike has demoralized the left coal-carrying trade, and has brought the season to a premature close.

It is feared that manufacturing may be paralyzed in the large cities where anthracite coal is used.
