John K. Tener, of Washington county, Pa., was nominated for Governor of Pennsylvania by the Republican State Convention at Harrisburg, Pa. on Wednesday, May 19.

John K. Tener, 20 odd years ago famous as a professional ball player, now millionaire banker and member of Congress from the Twenty-fourth Pennsylvania district, is an Irishman.

After a high school education in Pittsburgh young Tener went to work, but was soon pitching ball for the Pittsburgh and Chicago clubs.

When A. G. Spalding took the All-America team on a trip around the world Tener went along as one of the pitchers.

Tener later helped from the ill-fated brotherhood, and when it collapsed gave up the game and went to Charlestown, Pa., where he made a fortune in coal lands, and where he now lives.

He owns a bank among other things. Mr. Tener has been Grand Exalted Ruler of the Elks of North America.

Mr. Tener is a handsome man and very popular in Washington.
