### THROUGH TO NEW YORK.

#### Express Trains to be Run Over Western Maryland Railroad.

The statement made by the Chambersburg Repository a few weeks ago, that in a year or two the New York Central through passenger trains would be run over the Western Maryland Railroad through Chambersburg, is corroborated by the following announcement just made by President Bush, of the Western Maryland Railway.  
"Within less than fifteen months finely-appointed express trains labeled New York Central Lines will be passing over the Western Maryland."  
Further statements have been made by a traffic manager as follows:  
Plans have been formulated by the engineering department of the Western Maryland for the building of a low-grade track to border the Blue Ridge Mountains, thus abolishing the climb directly over them. Although this would result in lengthening the route about 12 miles, it would give a lower average grade to Pittsburg and connection with the Pittsburgh & Lake Erie than the Baltimore and Ohio. This extension would necessitate the expenditure of approximately \$10,000,000.  
If this move is carried out the grade over the entire road will be considerably reduced and at the same time the officials would be in a position to operate fast passenger trains between Baltimore and York to Pittsburg and the West.  
It is also said that the Western Maryland extension from Cumberland, Md., to Connellsville, Pa., will be completed by November, 1911.

### DAMAGED BY FIRE.

#### FIRE STARTED ON BACK PORCH.

**\$1,000 Worth of Property Destroyed.**  
An alarm of fire was sounded yesterday afternoon at 1.40 o'clock, for a fire which started on the back porch of the residence occupied by Mrs. A. E. Fowler and family, East Main street, which destroyed over \$1,000 worth of property.  
The building is owned by George Batson, of Baltimore.  
Mrs. Fowler and son Guy, lose upward of \$500 on furniture, china, etc., with an insurance of \$300, in the Baltimore County Fire Insurance Company. The damage to the house will amount to about \$400, insured in the Carroll county Mutual Fire Insurance Company.  
How the fire started on the porch, is a mystery, as Mrs. Fowler and daughter Grace were asleep in an up-stairs room, when the fire was discovered, and made a narrow escape. A parrot, which was in a cage, was burned to death. The back part of the building was considerably damaged by fire, while the interior of the building suffered more from water than fire.

### MEAN TIME AND EASTERN STANDARD TIME.

**When Day and Night are Equal.**  
While according to the astronomical calculations the local almanacs the day and night were equal in this latitude on the 21st of last March and are again equal today, this is not correct as time is now measured. The calculations for these almanacs are probably made in accordance with mean time, the previous nearest holds good throughout the year. But Eastern Standard time, by which we are now governed, varied three minutes from this rule on the date named, the sun having risen at 5.33 and set at 6.38. The variation referred to by standard time was also much greater at an early part of the year, on the 1st day of which the sun rose at 7.27 and set at 4.53, while the local almanacs had sunrise at 7.23 and sunset at 4.37.  
These comparisons have been made from the Baltimore Sun and Frederick almanacs.

### Through Whirlpool Rapids at Niagara Falls.

Niagara Falls, N. Y., September 18.—Capt Klaus Larsen, in his little motor boat the Ferro late this afternoon made a successful trip from the foot of the escarpment on the whirlpool rapids to within a mile of Lewiston a distance of four and one-half miles. He started from the Maid of the Mist dock at 4.45 and ran on a rock near the American shore at 5.30. Despite the battering of the whirlpool rapids, Larsen went through the rapids and under the cantilever bridge, under the engine running at top speed, and was caught in the swift drift break of water to whirlpool rapids. Larsen held to the middle of the channel and in less than three minutes had made the great trip. The trip through the rapids of the time, but at Great Wave it was shot 20 feet out of the water. The boat landed right and continued to the pool.
