

First: A farm containing 199 1/2 ACRES OF LAND, more or less, situate in Carroll County, Maryland, on the road leading from Taneytown to Bruceville, about 2 1/2 miles from Taneytown and 3 1/2 miles from Keymar Station on the Western Maryland Railroad, and 1/2 mile from Crab's Station on the Frederick division of the Northern Central Railroad, and adjoining the land of Wesley Wine Miller, I. Louis Reifsnider and "The Home Property" of the late Isaiah Reifsnider.

The improvements thereon consist of a large and comfortable BRICK DWELLING, a good bank barn, wagon sheds and corn cribs attached, grain shed, hog pen, buggy shed, chicken houses and other necessary outbuildings. There is a never failing well of water at the dwelling with wind pump, and also a well of water at the barn.
