FROM HERE, THERE AND EVERYWHERE.

The House of Representatives has passed the bill to abolish five regiments of cavalry.

Much damage was caused by fire in Corpus Christi Catholic Church, Baltimore, where valuable crucifixes and candelabras were destroyed.

The Maryland Public Service Commission has sued the Easton Light and Fuel Company for not having amended its plant to furnish better gas.

Mrs. Susie F. Brewer has sued Dr. Victor T. Schlosser, of Hagerstown, for \$5,000 damages, charging that he pulled the wrong teeth from her mouth.

It is claimed that in the last few years there have been more than 100 dynamite explosions in buildings whose owners or builders had trouble with building trades unions.

The short supply of potatoes, and the high price, have led to the importation of some cargoes from South Africa. It is the first time potatoes have been imported from that continent.

A lobster weighing 27 pounds was caught the other day about five miles off shore at Atlantic City, N. J. It is said to be the largest ever caught in those waters and one of the largest ever found anywhere.

Catholics in Frederick, Md., are making preparations, under the direction of Father William J. Kane, for the celebration of the seventy-fifth anniversary of the consecration of St. John's Church on April 21.

The Bureau of Statistics of Department of Commerce and Labor computes that enough sugar is consumed in the United States each year to allow each person \$2 per month, or we eat seven pounds a month apiece.

A little pet terrier almost cost his mistress' life when he snapped and bit at those who attempted to carry her from her burning home; in his loyalty to her he kept off the rescuers until he was smothered in a shawl and taken away.

The Public Service Commission has aided the corporate development of the long-proposed railroad in Southern Maryland. It is said that the building of this much-needed connection from Washington across to Point Lookout, on the Chesapeake Bay, is now assured.

New gold fields have been discovered in the Yukon territory near Dawson, and hundreds of miners have rushed there to stake out claims. Many will probably perish in the bitter cold. So says a report from U. S. Consul Cole at Dawson. He says the discovery is one of the best since the Klondike was opened.

One of the vast enterprises of this country is the pulp and paper business which has been built up in Maine in recent years. Towns and railroads have been built because of it and the total wages paid the more than nine thousand men now employed in this business exceed that of the cotton industry. Spruce is the wood used in making the pulp for paper.

Funeral services for the battleship "Maine" and for the 26 men who went down with the ship 14 years ago, have been arranged between the Governments of the United States and of Cuba. Shortly after March 4, the human skeletons having been removed from her hull, the "Maine" is to be towed to deep water in the Gulf of Mexico and sunk. The occasion will be one of ceremony.

Christian churches, other than the Orthodox Greek Church, have never been allowed in Russia. But the rule has now been broken. The Czar has given special permission to Dr. MacArthur of New York to establish a Baptist church and college at St. Petersburg. But the American clergyman had to promise not to mention Russian politics, nor preach anything to which the Greek church could object.






