Checks Under \$1.00 Illegal. The Cambridge Record says: "There seems to be a general ignorance of the law enacted by Congress in 1909 making checks of less than one dollar illegal."

A Kent county man wrote Congressman Covington about the matter and received the following information: S. 2982 - An act to codify, revise and amend the penal laws of the United States. Approved March 9, 1909, in effect January 1, 1910.

Sec. 173 - No person shall make, issue, circulate or pay out any note, check, memorandum, token or other obligation for a less sum than one dollar, intended to circulate as money or to be received or used in lieu of lawful money of the United States; and every person so offending shall be fined not more than five hundred dollars, or imprisoned not more than six months, or both."

The above may be the law; but it is one that is broken thousands of times every day, and such checks are paid by the banks the same as larger ones - Carroll Record.
