John D. Rockefeller celebrated his 73rd birthday on last Monday.

Japan has ordered 18 large locomotives for the Japanese Imperial Railways from the Baldwin Locomotive Works, U. S. A.

Girl bootblacks will displace boys in Pittsburgh department store shoe shops, as the latter are annoyed by hobble-skirted customers.

While William J. Bryan and family were in Baltimore vandals stole 56 squares of cement sidewalk from their Fairview home in Nebraska.

It is stated that in 1910, 2,600 people in the State of Maryland died from tuberculosis. This is more than died from any other seven diseases.

An inventory of the cutlery and kitchen utensils belonging to the Shah of Persia places their value at twenty-five million dollars. All are gold, gold plate and silver. Some are decorated with precious stones.

The purchase and building of the Panama canal to date has cost the United States \$276,487,000. Of this amount \$137,836,000 has been paid out of the general fund of the Treasury and the remainder from bond issues.

The two big conventions ignored the Woman Suffrage movement entirely. F. R. therefore has the field to himself, and will likely add equal suffrage to the list of blessings to accrue from the success of his new party.

Salisbury, Md., has appointed 3 plain clothes men to enforce speed laws in that city, furnished them with stop watches and measured off certain parts of the city so that the speed of automobiles can be accurately ascertained.

One thousand, three hundred and fifty-three school children of Williamsport deposited more than \$6,000 in cents, nickles and dimes in school savings banks during the term just closed. The total now on deposit is \$31,276.07.

China is so eager to learn about Christianity that the American Bible Society is unable to supply the demand for Bibles. This year given over fifty-two thousand dollars for Bible work for the Chinese.

The Liberty Bell, resting in Independence Hall Museum, Philadelphia, shows signs of disintegration and the crack is growing longer. Efforts will be made to find, if possible, some way in which this sacred relic may be preserved indefinitely.

The Skin and Cancer Hospital, on Mount street, Baltimore—the first of its kind south of Philadelphia—was dedicated with impressive exercises Monday afternoon. The dedicatory address was made by the Mayor after an invocation by Bishop Corrigan.

The Lutheran reunion at Pen-Mar, will be held on July 25. There will be the usual program of addresses, among the speakers being Dr. W. A. Granville, President of Pennsylvania College, and Rev. J. M. Reimensnyder, D. D. Ex-President Roosevelt, president leader of the bolting Republican movement, has been invited to speak.

Reports submitted to the National Education Association, which opened its fifteenth annual convention in Chicago on Monday, said that of the 20,000,000 public school pupils in the United States, 12,000,000 were being educated in rural schools and that only one-third of the country boys and girls were making a satisfactory showing.

The new national flag, bearing 48 stars, emblematic of all the States, including Arizona and New Mexico, recently admitted, was flung from all Federal structures in the country and from the American navy throughout the world on July 4th. Thirteen stars only will be permitted in the blue square of the flags that are less than five feet wide, to avoid overcrowding.

An Englishman has invented a device for spectacles by which one may see what is back of him as well as in front. He manages this by putting small mirrors in the frames of spectacles. It should prove useful to deaf people and men who work on railroad tracks—and what a boon to nervous ones who are "afraid to go home in the dark," especially along lonely country roads.

The House Committee on Judiciary, Washington, D. C., on Monday made its final report in the case of Judge Robert W. Archibald, of the Court of Commerce, recommending by unanimous vote that he be impeached before the bar of the United States Senate. Thirteen articles of impeachment were presented by the committee and the official conduct of this jurist bitterly assailed by the House committee.

New Party Convention Will Nominate Ticket.

Colonel Roosevelt's third party convention will be held in Chicago on August 5, either in the Coliseum or Orchestra hall.

The call for it, signed by Roosevelt leaders of forty states and addressed "To the people of the United States without regard to past political differences," was issued through Senator Joseph M. Dixon, campaign manager, in the new national headquarters of the party at the Hotel Manhattan, N. Y.

The party will probably be called the Progressive National party. The convention will decide as to that. Eight states—Maine, North Carolina, Delaware, South Carolina, Arkansas, Mississippi, Idaho and Nevada—are not represented in the provisional committee which signed the call for the convention.
