THE TARIFF IN SUMMER DRESS FOR HOT-WEATHER READING.

A fancy wash fabric manufactured in New England for 9 2/3 cents a yard is sold by the manufacturer at 14 1/2 cents—a manufacturing profit of 47 1/2 per cent, less selling expenses of 5 or, at most, 6 per cent. The jobber (wholesale distributor) adds 3 1/2 cents—a profit of 23 1/2 per cent, less selling expenses. The retailer adds another 4.28 per cent, and the American housewife gets the cloth at 25 cents—cloth that in England can be bought retail for 17 cents, identical in weave and quality! WHY?

Cotton curtain scrim, found in millions of homes, is made in America at a cost that gives the manufacturer ample profit, selling it to the print works at 6 cents a yard. The print works sells to the jobber at 10 1/3 cents, although it finishes the goods at a cost of 1.37 cents. The jobber adds 20 per cent, laying down the curtain scrim to the department store at 12 1/2 cents. The retailer charges the American housewife 19 to 29 cents. More than likely he advertises it as "IMPORTED" and sells it for the top price, because the tariff is so high that the genuine imported goods cannot be sold for less. It costs just as much in England to make this curtain material, yet the English retailer sells it for 15 1/5 cents (7 1/2 pence) a yard, against 19 to 29 cents under the American tariff! WHY?—From N. Y. World.

INJURIES ARE FATAL.

Harry Dell, 19, Dies After Being Struck By Train. Asleep on the tracks of the Western Maryland Railway at Miller's Station, Carroll county, Harry Dell, 19 years old, of Manchester, was struck by a train at midnight Saturday. He died at the Union Protestant Infirmary, Baltimore, at 11.45 o'clock Tuesday morning. The train that struck Dell was running on the Harrisburg division of the railway. It was several hours late. The crew was not aware that the man had been struck, and he was found by two men living at Miller's Station. Dell was taken to the home of Mr. Henry Rhinehart, where first aid was given by Mrs. Laura Bull, a daughter of Mr. Rhinehart, who is a trained nurse. Dr. J. H. Sherman, of Manchester, was summoned, and he advised that the young man be taken to a hospital. Mr. Charles H. Ganter, of Manchester, placed the injured man in his automobile and made a record run of 35 miles to Baltimore. At the hospital physicians realized that Dell was in a serious condition, and in an attempt to save his life they amputated both legs, which had been mashed almost to a pulp, but despite their efforts bloodpoisoning set in, which coupled with the shock he received caused his death Tuesday morning. Coroner Macht of the Northwest District was notified and after an investigation rendered a verdict that Dell came to his death as the result of an accident. He said an inquest was unnecessary. Dell was employed by a farmer. He had visited a friend Saturday night and was returning to his home when he decided to take a rest. Sitting on the tracks he fell asleep.
