HOUSE, FURNITURE AND JEWELRY BURNED.

MRS. GORDON CUMMING'S PROPERTY AT FREEDOM, OCCUPIED BY MRS. MARY K. ELLIOTT AND FAMILY, DESTROYED BY FIRE ON MONDAY.

One of the most destructive fires occurring in this county for many years was that of Monday when the large and handsome residence occupied by Mrs. Mary K. Elliott and family in Freedom district was burned to the ground together with the furniture and much valuable jewelry.

How the fire originated is not known. About 3 o'clock in the afternoon several members of the family who were downstairs heard something fall upstairs and upon investigation discovered the flames which had already made too much headway to permit any chance of their being extinguished. It is thought probable that the fire started in some way from the chimney.

The residence, which was owned by Mrs. A. P. Gordon Cummings, of Washington, D. C., was a large 26-room house, and was less than a year old. It was furnished with the finest of the modern style. Several thousand dollars worth of jewelry and silverware, the property of the Elliott family, was destroyed, and almost all of the furniture and clothing in the house were burned.

Mrs. Elliott barely escaped with her life. She went to the second floor soon after the fire was discovered to carry out some jewelry and other valuables. She was overcome with smoke and fell unconscious to the floor. Her son, who had seen her go upstairs, ran after her and stumbled over her. He carried her to the rear of the house and down the back steps. The loss was about \$10,000, with small insurance.

Link. Stricken with heart disease while on her way to church, Mrs. Sophia E. Link, 72 years old, 2344 Edmondson avenue, Baltimore, died suddenly Wednesday night.

Mrs. Link was advised to ride, but the driver, who had seen her go out, felt so well she would enjoy the walk. After crossing the Edmondson avenue bridge she suffered pains in her left side, and on the advice of friends, she started back home accompanied by her granddaughter, Miss Maria E. Link.

The pains increased and she was aided to the office of Dr. Sowers, where she died a few minutes later. Mrs. Link was born in Frederick, Md. She is survived by a son, A. D. Link, and several grandchildren. She had been a member of St. Paul's congregation for many years.

Frazier. Jno. H. Frazier, proprietor of a Fred. erick cafe and one of the best known democrats in Frederick, died at the City Hospital Sunday, following an operation for double hernia. He became ill at the inauguration in Washington and was taken to the hospital three days later.

He was one of the leading promoters of outdoor sports in Western Maryland and gave liberally to charitable organizations. He was a candidate for the Democratic nomination for Sheriff. He was one of the promoters of the semi-professional baseball team which represented the city several years ago and was organizer of the famous Diamond baseball team, which won the State championship three years ago. He was well known in this city.
