EXTRA SESSION OF CONGRESS.

President Wilson has issued a proclamation, calling the Congress together, in extraordinary session, on April 7. The main purpose of this extra session is the enactment of tariff legislation, in accordance with the pledges of the Democratic platform.

It is very important that legislation of this character should be disposed of as early as possible inasmuch as the business of the country depends largely upon the tariff rates, and where there are to be changes as there will be under the Democratic regime, the country cannot know the schedules too soon.

So that, we think it was wise in the President calling this extra session, and it will be the duty of the Democratic majority in Congress to go to work at once and frame a bill covering the various schedules in accordance with Democratic ideas. Of course this cannot be hurriedly done. It is a most difficult thing to frame a tariff bill where there are so many interests to consider.


