THE GREATNESS OF A COUNTRY.

ONE OF OUR SUBURBS.

A growing suburb of Westminster which has not hitherto received its deserved quota of attention from the press or the public, is Crowtown, a residential section numbering an ever increasing population.

A GOOD SUGGESTION.

A suggestion in The Sentinel of last week commends itself to us as one that should be brought to the attention of all Carroll countians.

In the leading editorial entitled "The Star Spangled Banner," the editor of The Sentinel comments on the proposed celebration of the centennial of the National Anthem, to be held in Baltimore in September, 1914, and in conclusion says:

"The people of Carroll county have a peculiar interest in the contemplated celebration, at least the right to a deeper interest than those of any other section of the State or country. Francis Scott Key was a native of the county. He was born where the village which bears his name now stands. A pilgrimage to his birthplace should

be a feature of the celebration. Leading and influential citizens of the county should take up the matter and urge such a pilgrimage upon its projectors. Further, a movement should be inaugurated to have the site of his birth marked by a suitable memorial. He won a great and lasting honor by writing the hymn which has become, by common consent, the national anthem. Several monuments have been erected to perpetuate his memory in the minds and hearts of his countrymen though his best monument and the most lasting is the song itself.

SEALED PROPOSALS for building one section of State Highway. As follows: CARROLL COUNTY: One section along the Frederick Pike, from Ridgeville to South Branch of Patapsco River, about 1.60 miles in length, (Resurfacing Macadam), will be received by the State Roads Commission, at its offices, 534 N. Howard St., Baltimore, Maryland, until 12 m. on the 22nd day of July, 1913, at which time and place they will be publicly opened and read.

Bids must be made upon the blank form contained in the book of specifications, which will be furnished by the Commission upon application and payment of \$2.00 for each section. Blue prints of each section will be furnished at the rate of 25 cents for each half mile.

No bids will be received unless accompanied by a certified check for the sum of Five Hundred (\$500) Dollars, payable to the State Roads Commission.
