LAST REGISTRATION DAY TUESDAY.

Now that the smoke of the primary battle has blown over there is one very important fact staring every Democratic voter in the face. That is the fact that the principle battle is yet to be fought. The Democratic ticket, both state and county, must be elected this November and by a very large majority. This cannot be done unless everybody is willing to do his part. To start with it is very necessary that all Democrats are registered. In this work all can aid. After this has been accomplished it is necessary to see that all who are registered come out and vote in November. This is a work that cannot be left to a few and expect it to be done properly. We are sure Carroll county will give her usual large majority for both the state and county ticket in November. But what we want to impress on the minds of all Democrats in the county is the fact that the most important battle is yet to come, and that we must not rest satisfied with the fact that we took an active part in the primary. It is the privilege of every Democrat to express his views about the various candidates in the Democratic primary, but it then becomes the duty of every Democrat to vote at the general election and to do what he can to further the election of the entire ticket.

Henry W. Williams, who is, perhaps, as thoroughly independent in his Democracy as any man in Baltimore, and who was a strong supporter of Blair Lee in the recent primary, declares himself as strongly in favor of the election of Mr. Harrington.

Maryland Bull Moosers are not quite ready to say whether they will support the Republican ticket nominated last Friday or whether they will put a ticket of their own in the field.

Club after club is being organized in Baltimore for Harrington, McMullen and Ritchie, which shows that the Democrats are out for victory in November.

One of the most learned judges in this State, in speaking of the fitness of Emerson C. Harrington for the high office of governor of Maryland, stated that he could not see how any person could question his ability, for it seemed to him that Mr. Harrington had filled every position he had ever occupied somewhat better than anyone else had been able to do.

Mayor Preston, of Baltimore has come out heartily for Harrington, Ritchie and McMullen, the Democratic nominees.

Senator Lee says, "I am going to vote for Mr. Harrington because I am loyal to the will of the majority. The future of the state depends now upon the conduct of all parties to this great primary fight within the party."

Auto Climbs 9940 Feet.
Driving his Maxwell touring car and carrying 600 pounds, E. F. Clark, of the Pacific Telephone Co. successfully attained a height of 9940 feet, surmounting Tioga Pass in the Sierra Nevada. This is believed to be the greatest elevation ever attained by a motor car. It was made in a trip from Los Angeles to the Yosemite over a trail heretofore used only by wagon traffic.

"Spook" on Telephone Line.

Capt R. F. Quillen, of Seaford, Del., reports a spook using his telephone line. For several mornings Quillen has been awakened by the telephone bell, which starts ringing promptly at 2 o'clock and continues to ring until somebody answers.

The line is direct to central, Quillen being the only subscriber thereon, and would, therefore, have to be operated by the operator at central, but the night operator says that he knows nothing of the call, and has not had a connection set up with the telephone. No one answers when the captain hollers, and there is no way of tracing the spook.
