

Notice to CONTRACTORS

Bids will be received by the County Commissioners of Carroll County, Maryland, at the office of the County Commissioners in the Court House, at Westminster, until Monday, July 24, at 12 o'clock, 1916, for the building of two abutments and wing-walks for bridge over Bare Branch, at Mayberry, in Carroll County, Maryland, as per blue-print accompanying these specifications.

All bids shall be by the cubic yard for the substructure as follows: A cubic yard price for concrete work, including the removing of present wood-on-bridge also, price per cubic yard for stone masonry including the removing of the old wooden bridge in the present work.

THE WORK TO BE DONE—Is the removing of the present wooden bridge, using stone in the old abutments for the rebuilding of the new abutments. These stone are to be used as far as they will go; the balance of the substructure will either be built of stone or concrete; that is the reason bids are asked for on stone work and concrete.

The bids shall include in yard price named for substructure, all balling, cofferdamming, pumping, excavations, etc., which may be required for the completion of this work according to plan and specifications exhibited herewith. Should it be necessary to go to a greater depth or length than that shown on the accompanying plan, for all such additional quantities the bidder will be paid for at the rate of his per yard price.

All bidders must deposit with bid, a certified check made payable to the County Commissioners of Carroll County, Maryland, for the sum of Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars.

Checks of unsuccessful bidders shall be returned to them upon award of contract. Check of successful bidder shall be retained by the County Commissioners as security for the faithful performance on his part of the work set forth in his proposal or bid and as indemnity against any damage that might be caused by failure on the part of said bidder to perform the conditions of his proposal or bid.

Check shall be returned to the successful bidder when he shall have complied with the terms and conditions of his proposal and upon the acceptance of his bid (for the faithful performance and completion of his work) which shall be equal to the amount of his bid.

No bid will be considered upon any other than the drawings and specifications on file nor from any bidder who fails to comply with the above conditions.
