PROCLAMATION

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION OF MARYLAND CREATING A BUDGET SYSTEM. WHEREAS, at the January Session of the General Assembly of Maryland, held in the year 1915 of said State, passed, with Chapter 150 of said Act, an Act to amend the Constitution of this State, and to provide for the submission of said amendment to the qualified voters of this State; and which said Act is in words and figures following:

"CHAPTER 150. AN ACT to propose an amendment to Section 34 of Article III, title Legislative Department of the Constitution of this State, regulating the making of appropriations by the General Assembly of Maryland in regular session, and to provide for the submission of said amendment to the qualified voters of this State for adoption or rejection.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Maryland, that the members of each of the two houses concurring, that the following be and the same is hereby proposed as an amendment to Section 34 of Article III, title Legislative Department, of the Constitution of this State, the same adopted by the qualified voters of the State, as herein provided to become Section 34 of Article III of the Constitution of Maryland, and shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its adoption, except in accordance with the following provisions: (1) Every appropriation bill shall be either a Budget Bill, or a Supplementary Appropriation Bill, as hereinafter mentioned. (2) First. Within twenty days after the convening of the General Assembly (except in the case of a newly elected Governor, and then within thirty days after his inauguration), unless such time shall be extended by the General Assembly for the session at which the Budget Bill is to be submitted, the Governor shall submit to the General Assembly two budgets, one for each of the ensuing fiscal years, the first of which shall contain a complete plan of proposed expenditures and estimated revenues for the particular year to which the budget is submitted, and shall show the estimated surplus or deficit of revenues at the end of such year. Accounting for each budget shall be made in a statement showing: (1) the revenues and expenditures for each of the two fiscal years next preceding; (2) the current account of the State; (3) the debts and surplus or deficit of the State; (4) an estimate of the State's fiscal condition at the beginning and end of each of the fiscal years covered by the two budgets so provided; (5) any explanation the Governor may desire to make as to the important items of the budget, and any suggestion as to methods for the reduction or increase of the State's revenues.

Second. Each budget shall be divided into two parts, and the first part shall be designated "General Appropriations," and shall embrace an itemized estimate of the appropriations: (1) for the General Assembly as certified to the Governor in the manner hereinafter provided;
