

Want to Do Away With Toll Gates.

To urge the purchase by the State of about 30 miles of pike running from Frederick to Westminster by way of Libertytown, a delegation of about 100 residents of the section of the county traversed by the highway will call on Governor Emerson C. Harrington some time after April 10, and seek his assistance.

Tuesday morning a letter seeking appointment with the Governor was signed and mailed by the county commissioners.

The proposed new State road runs from Frederick to Westminster by way of Libertytown, and is about 30 miles long. About 22 miles of the road are in Frederick county and about 8 miles in Carroll county. There are at present five toll gates on this road, one being north of Frederick on the Market street pike, another at Mt. Pleasant, another at Liberty and two on the New Windsor pike below Unionville.

The farmers in the section of the county which is traversed by the roads are much interested in the plan, and it is expected that fully a hundred of them will make up the delegation which will go before the Governor on the date to be set by him. The county commissioners will also likely accompany the party.

It has been pointed out that this section of the county has been neglected in State road work, and that if the toll gates on the roads in question are removed, it will mean the end of practically all those obstructions now remaining in this county. It will be recalled that it was through the efforts of Governor Harrington, State Treasurer John M. Dennis, the county commissioners and the Frederick Board of Trade that the two roads to Washington in the southern section of the county were purchased by the State.

It is also pointed out that these new roads would mean a great boost for Frederick business men.

Sometime ago a huge delegation appeared before the county commissioners and urged that action be taken looking to converting the present pikes into State highways.

A plan proposed sometime ago of having a new road built south of the Pennsylvania railroad crossing on the North Market street pike, to connect with the Emmitsburg State road, at Harmony Grove, is still hanging fire, it is said. By building this link, the present toll gate on the Market street pike would be avoided, as well as two dangerous grade crossings—Frederick Citizen.
