OUR ADMIRABLE LOCAL EXEMPTION BOARD.

When such representative citizens as Dr. Henry M. Fitzhugh, Edward O. Cash and William Arthur were selected as the Local Exemption Board for Carroll County the public were assured that their duties would be well discharged. Now that Carroll County has filled her quota and supplied the national army with as high spirited, intelligent, courageous and patriotic young men as can be assembled within the length and breadth of our country, it is appropriate that the arduous, faithful and devoted labors of Dr. Fitzhugh and Messrs. Cash and Arthur should be recalled. These gentlemen performed their duties quietly, unobtrusively and effectively, and gave, at great personal sacrifice, their time and their ability to the impartial discharge of the heavy responsibilities of their office. Animated by patriotic fervor and zeal they have declined all compensation, and have made their work a part of their contribution to their country and the cause of freedom.

It must be a source of gratification to every citizen of this County to know that its Exemption Board has not only carefully and conscientiously and satisfactorily discharged its duties, but that it has also made a record for economical administration. The total cost for all the many details of the conscription was kept at the remarkably low sum of \$1.36 for every man entering the service of the Nation! This record can be surpassed in the United States; and it affords an illustration of what economy, intelligence and patriotism in public office can accomplish. The Carroll County record should have imitation everywhere. The officials of the United States and of the State of Maryland have written letters to the Board commending its members in the highest manner.
