



Clause Making Strikes Illegal To Stay In Cummins Measure.
Washington, October 8.—Anti-strike provisions of the Cummins bill for the return of the railroads to their private owners will not be stricken out despite the protests of labor leaders. Senator Cummins, of Iowa, chairman of the Interstate Commerce Committee of the Senate, stated this afternoon. The bill will make a strike of railroad workers illegal and would fix a penalty for such strikes. Railroad brotherhoods' officials and officials of the American Federation of Labor appeared before the committee to protest against the antistrike provision.
