





WHY HIGHER TELEPHONE RATES ARE NEEDED NOW

SOME ONE HAS ASKED why this company is asking now for higher rates in view of the fact that at some points an increase in our rates was made some time ago.

DURING THE PERIOD that our property was under Government control, the revenues from operation belonged to the Government and the Government was responsible for the expenses. THE STUDY OF THESE requirements was made shortly after the Armistice was signed, when there were indications that there would be a decrease in the prevailing costs of labor and material. With a desire not to burden our subscribers with any more than was absolutely necessary, this company established rate schedules—not adequate at the time—but which we believed, with the anticipated decrease in costs of labor and material, would prove to be sufficient.
