

Manchester District Letter.

From Oregon comes this message. "Long Creek is a town of 300 or 400 people. Among the business places are two "Pastime" houses, and one "short order" house. Can any reader tell us what is meant by the above? Is it little wonder we have high prices? When New York was snow bound, people would not work for less than from 50c to \$1.50 per hour. From New York City comes this message: "I visited a church last night where a men's club had a meeting. They had two addresses by able, educated men, but no prayer, no gospel hymn, no mention of the name of Jesus. It is encouraging to learn that when some churches become lukewarm, and others are thinking of closing their doors, that the First Presbyterian Church of Seattle, Washington, has 7,267 members. On Saturday last we had a chat with a man on "churches" and their "influence." The result of the conversation was, that should a church close its doors, the neighborhood would soon become a lawless and uncivilized region. The Inter-Church Movement, so thoroughly advertised in the newspapers and magazines the past few months, has done much to make some people see the need of church service and fellowship. "Three thousand killed at Leipzig," were startling headlines of the newspapers in regard to Germany. If the German Empire declared "peace," Nov. 11, 1918, why should such news now spread, giving dissatisfied America yet more reason to rebel? The Bible injunction, "Be ye at peace with all men so far as lieth in your power," is unheeded, both by nations and individuals. A friend told me there is more moving and changing places this year than ever before. There must be a reason for the unsettled condition of affairs in both the town and country. In some towns the jails, being empty, will be used as homes for those who cannot pay the enormous rents asked by avaricious landlords. A store in Kansas took a novel way to advertise. A cake was baked which required 125 pounds of flour, 10 gallons of milk, 50 dozen eggs, 100 pounds of sugar, 60 pounds of butter, 7 pounds of baking powder, and a quart of vanilla. It was cut and divided between 2,000 customers. Recently in New York City, old buildings that housed 70 families, were torn down to make place for a large moving picture theatre that is now being built. "Tearing down and building greater," so the Bible prophesies, causes people to be homeless and other troubles. Easter-time seems to be awakening-time, as the birds push forth into new and green foliage, the flowers burst into bloom. "Easter flowers are sweet and fair. Birds are singing everywhere; All is gladness, far and near, Christ is risen! Easter's here." If an abundance of ice on the trees during January and February is an indication of fruit, we may expect an abundance this coming season. One beautiful sunny morning, late in March, as I was trudging wearily along a country road, thinking how tiresome the daily walk was, when others ride and enjoy themselves, I was suddenly awakened from my reverie by a bird happily singing, seeming to say, "cheer up, cheer, listen to me." Again it sang, "cheer up, cheer, cheer, God is good to me." Walking began to be less tiresome. Soon I heard "cheer up, cheer, cheer, cheer, God is good to me." Then I straightened up, saw how brightly the sun shone how the birds sang so sweetly, and the air so bracing that I took deep breaths of it, which made me step lightly and I felt so thankful for life, health, strength, and all the blessings He continually bestows upon us. 
