Clarence B. Myers, son of John M. Myers, orchardist of Bachman's Valley, is the State champion corn grower. He produced on a measured acre 113 bushels shelled or 22 1/2 barrels of dry corn. Variety of corn was Johnson County White. This acre did not receive any extra attention. It was well cultivated and handled in the most approved methods of corn culture. The prize will be a rip to the Tri-State Boys' Agricultural Camp in Virginia with all expenses paid. The camp will last a week or ten days. Prominent men will speak at the camp and valuable instruction will be given along agricultural lines.






