ODD FELLOWS OUT IN FORGE

ONE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN TAKE THE OBLIGATION—ABOUT 1000 IN PARADE—DEGREES GIVEN IN ARMORY.

The monster rally of the Carroll County Lodges of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows held Tuesday evening, May 18th, in Westminster, proved to be a most surprising success.

The following lodges participated in this parade: Fort Carroll No. 11, Sparrow's Point; Monumental No. 14, Baltimore; Daniel and Jacob No. 23, Manchester; Taney No. 28, Taneytown; Prosperity No. 58, Mount Airy; Salem No. 60, Westminster; Mason and Dixon No. 69, Harriet; Atlantic No. 72, Baltimore; Mount Zion No. 87, Baltimore; St. Stephen's No. 95, Daniel; Garden No. 114, Gardenville; Patascoe No. 120, Baltimore and Sulphur Springs No. 130, New Windsor.

The parade was led on Main street in front of the Opera House and was led by mounted officers and the Mayor and City Council.

The first division, under the leadership of Marshal Humbert and his aide, Mr. Thomas Lindsay, was led by the P. O. S. of A. Band of Pleasant Valley and was composed of the representatives of Taney Lodge, Littlestown Lodge and Daniel and Jacob Lodge.

The second division, under the direction of Marshal Stoner and his aide, Master Henry Harbaugh, was led by the Boy Scout Band of Westminster, and was composed of St. Stephens Lodge, Mason and Dixon Lodge and Prosperity Lodge.

The third division, under the direction of Marshal Zile, was led by the Oak Orchard Band and was composed of Sulphur Springs Lodge, Salem Lodge and the one hundred and nineteen candidates who after the parade received their degrees at the Armory.

The parade moved promptly at 6:30 o'clock east on Main street to Church, South on Church to Green, West on Green to Center, North on Center to Main, West on Main to Pennsylvania avenue, up Pennsylvania avenue to Union; across Union to Main, East on Main to Longwell and were disbanded at the Armory.

There were approximately one thousand Odd Fellows in this parade. All in full regalia and on foot and was recognized by all as being one of the largest demonstrations of its kind ever held in the county.

After the parade the candidates were ushered into the Armory where they received the first, second and third degrees of the Order. The first degree was conferred by the degree team of Taney Lodge, of Taneytown; the second degree was conferred by the degree team of Prosperity Lodge; of Mount Airy; the third degree was conferred by the degree team of Sulphur Springs Lodge, of New Windsor.

The work done by these teams in the conferring of the degrees was spoken of by those who are acquainted with the work as being of such a character as would call for the highest compliments in every branch of the work. Quite a number of the Grand Lodge officers of the State were present to witness this work. There were in all one hundred and nineteen candidates who received these degrees. These candidates were from the following lodges: Sulphur Springs Lodge, 52; Prosperity Lodge, 29; Salem Lodge, 15; Daniel and Jacob Lodge, 16; Taney Lodge, 11; and Mason and Dixon Lodge, 2. After the conferring of the degrees the members were invited to the Firemen's Building where a ham buffet luncheon, consisting of ham and cheese sandwiches, coffee, Zile's ice cream and cigars were served.

Quite a little difficulty was experienced in feeding this delegation. It was estimated that approximately eight hundred men surged into the building with the expectation of all being waited on at one time. While some experienced difficulty in being served, the majority were taken care of in a most remarkable manner.
