

Chester, Pa., May 5.—The lives of 20 horses were sacrificed when 25 cars of a long freight train, east-bound, were wrecked early today on the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad between Boothwyn and Oden stations, blocking traffic for many hours. Both tracks were piled high with wreckage for 800 feet, while at other points cars were hurled down both sides of a 20-foot embankment. The horses were killed outright or so badly injured that it was necessary to put them out of their misery. They were fine draught and work horses.
