

WIFE FIRES, HUSBAND KILLS IN NOBENT MAN

Milwaukee, Wis., June 16.—Because she lied to her husband, Mrs. Thomas Foran, twenty-four, and her helpmate are in jail charged with the murder of Joseph Wamser, killed by Foran as a "burglar."

Last Saturday, according to her story, Mrs. Foran needed \$20 to buy a dress for one of her two children. Fearing to ask her husband for it, she took it from a box where he had hidden it. When he returned, she told him a burglar had ransacked the house, and to make her story strong, screamed: "There he is at the window now." Foran, with a revolver, ran outside and accused Wamser, the only one on the street, Wamser then struck Foran, knocking him down, and ran. Foran shot and killed him.

For three days the case puzzled the police. Yesterday Mrs. Foran broke down.

"Just a week ago our family was so happy," said Mrs. Foran in her cell. "Now see what I have brought upon us! I wanted to get a new dress for Edith, to wear at a church entertainment. All the little children were dressed so prettily. And my husband trusted me so! I never before lied to him."

"My wife said nothing to me about the dress," said Foran. "We needed

money badly. I'm paying for my home. But I forgive my wife. I love her dearly."

BASS STARVE AND EAT EACH OTHER UP IN KEYSER LAKE

Keyser, W. Va., June 15.—Because the Keyser reservoir which consists of an improvised lake covering about ten acres has become so thickly populated with black bass, caretakers at the dam report, large fish by the hundreds are starving to death, or dying from injuries sustained in cannibal fights.

The fish placed in the lake when it was constructed have propagated in such numbers, that the like water is fairly alive with them, and fishermen declare there is not sufficient food to sustain them and huge big fellows are preying on the smaller bass, and a constant under water warfare is waged.

Originally there was other fish such as catfish, fall fish and suckers, and a few goldfish, but these have all been "eaten up" long ago by the more powerful and voracious bass.

Some residents of Keyser will declare that the water is being impregnated with a fishy smell and taste. Fishing has not been permitted.

CHILD INHURT UNDER TRAIN

Then Conductor James P. McCormick saw a little human leg protrude over a rail, and Michael appeared none the worse for his experience, having only some scratches. Conductor McCormick grew sick and trembled when he realized his train had run over a human being, but the crew yelled, "Why, he's all right," and the laughing child confirmed the verdict.

McCormick, S. C., June 19.—Herbert Quarles, a negro, charged with attacking a white woman of this county, was hunched here this afternoon. The negro was captured by a posse of citizens and following identification by the victim he was forced to climb a tree and was then riddled with bullets.

568 MURDERED IN YEAR

London, June 16.—Murders by "rebels" in Ireland since July, 1920, have totalled 568, Sir Hamar Greenwood, chief secretary for Ireland, stated in the House of Commons today. The number of Crown Forces convicted for murder in the same period, he added, was: Military, none; Royal Irish Constabulary, one; police auxiliaries, one, the last named man being found insane.

Additional Voting Precincts. In Freedom District, Hampstead-District, New Windsor District, and the Second Precinct of Westminster District, Carroll County, Maryland. WHEREAS, the registered voters in Freedom District, Hampstead-District, New Windsor District, and the Second Precinct of Westminster District, Carroll County, Maryland, exceed 800 by reason of the ratification of the Nineteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States, extending Suffrage to all women, and WHEREAS, the Board of Election Supervisors of Carroll County, in their judgment believe it is expedient for the convenience of the voters of Freedom District, Hampstead-District, New Windsor District, and the Second Precinct of Westminster District, to be subdivided and new boundary lines for the same be made for the purpose of facilitating and expediting the casting of their ballots by the voters thereof. THEREFORE, in pursuance of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland 1920, Chapter 38, it is ORDERED this First day of June, 1921, by the Board of Election Supervisors of Carroll County that Freedom District known as the Fifth Election District of Carroll County be, and the same is hereby divided into two voting precincts, and that Hampstead District, known as the Seventh Election District of Carroll County be, and the same is hereby divided into two voting precincts, and that New Windsor District, known as the Eleventh Election District of Carroll County, be, and the same is hereby divided into two voting precincts, and that the Second Precinct of Westminster Election District, known as the Seventh Election District of Carroll County, be, and the same is hereby divided into two voting precincts. And it is further ORDERED that all the territory lying South of the Liberty Road and bounded by Baltimore and Howard Counties and Herrett District, shall be and constitute the First Precinct of the Fifth Election District, known as Freedom District; and that all the territory lying North of the Liberty Road and bounded by Baltimore County, Woolery's and Berrett Districts, shall be and constitute the Second Precinct of the Fifth Election District of Carroll County, known as Freedom District. And it is further ordered that all the territory in Hampstead District, lying West of the Baltimore and Hanover Turnpike Road, and South of the Hampstead and Westminster public road by Brighthart's Mill, shall be and constitute the First Precinct of the Eighth Election District, known as Hampstead District; and that all the remainder of the territory now known as Hampstead District, and lying North of the Hampstead and Westminster road, including the villages of Snyderburg and Greenmont, and East of the Baltimore and Hanover Turnpike road, shall be and constitute the Second Precinct of the Eighth Election District of Carroll County, known as Hampstead District. And it is further ordered that all the territory bound by the Western Maryland Railroad, starting at Medford and running to New Windsor to High Street on High Street to Church Street, down Church Street and out the New Windsor and Liberty Pike to Frederick line, and bounded by Frederick County, Westminster, and Franklin Districts, shall be and constitute the First Precinct of the Eleventh Election District, known as New Windsor District; and that all the territory on the North side of the Western Maryland Railroad from Medford to the Union Bridge District line, (except that part surrounded by High and Church Streets in New Windsor) and bounded by Uniontown Westminster and Union Bridge District, the usual division, and that part of the town of New Windsor lying East and North of High and Church streets and running out the New Windsor and Liberty Pike to the Frederick county line, shall be and constitute the Second Precinct of the Eleventh Election District, known as New Windsor District. And it is further ordered that all the territory bounded by the Western Maryland Railroad, Main Street, Pennsylvania Avenue to Sullivan Road at James M. Stoner's, following Sullivan Road, Manchester and Hampstead Districts, shall be and constitute the Second Precinct of the Seventh Election District, known as Westminster District; and that all the territory bounded by Pennsylvania Avenue to Sullivan Road, Manchester and Myers' Districts, Littlestown State road to the County Road running from Littlestown State road near B. F. Shriver's farm to Meadow Branch Church on Taneytown road, following said road to Westminster, down Main Street to the junction of Main Street and Pennsylvania Avenue, shall be and constitute the Fifth Precinct of the Seventh Election District of Carroll County, known as Westminster District. And it is further ordered that suitable polling places or houses be provided for said subdivided districts and precincts, as follows: For the First Precinct of the Fifth Election District, known as Freedom District, in the Phelps Building, in Sykesville, Md.; for the Second Precinct of the Fifth Election District, known as Freedom District, in Selby & Frizzell's Store at Eldersburg, Carroll County, Md.; for the First Precinct of the Eighth Election District, known as Hampstead District, in the Firemen's Building, Hampstead, Md.; for the Second Precinct in the Eighth Election District, known as Hampstead District, in the Leister's Garage Building, Hampstead, Md.; for the First Precinct of the Eleventh Election District, known as New Windsor District, in Warner Sisters' Store, New Windsor, Md.; for the Second Precinct of the Eleventh Election District, known as New Windsor District, in the Firemen's Building, in New Windsor, Md.; and for the Fifth Precinct of the Seventh Election District, known as Westminster District, in John Deley's Shop, Pennsylvania Avenue, Westminster, Carroll County, Maryland. And it is further ordered that suitable books of registry shall be obtained, and a sufficient number of competent persons be employed to transcribe the names of the registered voters in the books to be provided for in the several precincts; that each of said books may contain the names of all duly registered voters residing within the aforesaid respective precincts.
