PREDICTS DEMOCRATIC GAIN WEST FEELS IT HAS BEEN MISLED BY THE ADMINISTRATION

Washington, D. C., Dec. 31.—New reports of a drift of sentiment in the country for ex-President Wilson and his foreign policies were brought to Washington today by former Representative Ayres, Democrat, Kansas. He said that people are beginning to realize that they were misled in 1920 and if the election were held today, it would be overwhelmingly Democratic. Mr. Ayres predicted that the Democrats will gain throughout the West next fall. At least three members of the House are expected from Kansas, seven or eight from Missouri, two or three from Nebraska, and two from Colorado. Farmers and stock men have been forced into the bankruptcy courts by the absence of improvement in conditions. They complain that the Republicans have not kept their promises. "People out there are sick and tired of the promises made by the leaders of the Republican party and of their failure to deliver anything," Mr. Ayres said. "The Administration seems to be

floundering around with no set policy. With the leaders it is a case of 'cut and cover.' "Sentiment is changing wonderfully toward Wilson. Many Republicans are beginning to ask this question of one another: "I wonder how much difference there is between section 2 and section 4?" "They are coming around to Wilson and coming fast. "You can tell the difference in public meetings and on the streets. You can make a speech there and mention his name and policies and they are greeted with enthusiastic applause."

LIE BETWEEN THE RAILS AND ESCAPE WHEN TRAPPED ON BRIDGE BY TRAIN

Wilkes-Barre, Pa., Dec. 28.—Trapped in the center of a railway bridge spanning Nescopeck Creek, Harold Hollocher and Herman Reisenweaver, each 12 years of age, miraculously escaped death late today when they lay down between the rails and took chances with a limited train on the third-rail system of the Wilkes-Barre

& Hazelton Railway passing over them. The train was upon them so suddenly and either end of the bridge was so far away that to attempt escape by running would have meant certain death. To have jumped 30 feet into the creek would have been equally perilous.

Engineer John Comfort saw them at the time they saw the train. They looked appealingly at him and Comfort, realizing there was but a single chance between the boys and death dropped the window of his car, shouted and signaled to the boys to lie down between the rails. There was no use applying brakes, for the train, traveling at great speed, could not have possibly been stopped in time to save the boys.

Hollocher and Reisenweaver either caught the signals or had the presence of mind to realize their situation. They dropped between the rails, curled as close as they could to the ties, turned their heads sideways, shut their eyes and prayed. Comfort, too, closed his eyes as the train flashed over the boys, then applied sand and brakes and stopped as quickly as he could. Then, backing his train across the bridge, he stopped at the edge of the creek, called his conductor and went back, expecting to find two dead boys. To his delighted surprise they were alive, somewhat scared, but unscratched. They were trembling with joy and fear.

ART COURSE FOR WESTMINSTER.

Through the interest shown by the people of Carroll County and Westminister, especially, in the Art Exhibit and art demonstrations which have been given from time to time through the efforts of the Home Demonstration Agent, the Maryland Institute of Art has offered to start a course in art at Westminister providing such a class could be formed. They will furnish the teacher and all the class will have to do is to pay the expenses of the instructor and furnish their own materials.

This, we think, is a wonderful offer. Mr. Bennett, himself, was at the last meeting and made the offer directly to the Homemakers' Club. Anyone interested whether or not, as the instructor says, they can draw a straight line, but if they are interested in knowing how to appreciate art and to strive towards artistic expression are invited to join the class. It shall probably meet once a week for a series of eight or ten classes. The Institute will send an instructor and the meeting will be held in the County Agent's office. We are anxious to get personnel of the

class as soon as possible to know whether afternoon or night meetings will be preferred.
