**THE SUNDAY TEA**

**30 KNOWN DEAD AND 300 INJURED.  
 IN CENTRAL WEST STORM.**

Chicago, April 18.—Revised figures on the casualties and damage caused by the storm which swept over the Central States yesterday and last night today were: Thirty known dead, 15 in Illinois, 13 in Indiana and 2 in Missouri; 300 to 400 injured and property damage running into millions of dollars.

Accompanied by rains which sent streams coursing far beyond their usual channels, the storm brought added suffering and inconvenience to communities which for several days have been affected by flood conditions. A drop in the temperature below the seasonal normal added

to the discomfort of families whose homes having been destroyed by wind or made uninhabitable by flood are now living in tents or improvised shelters.

Indiana apparently felt the full effect of the windstorms yesterday. In that State 21 persons are known to have met death in different communities. Early yesterday the storm centered in Illinois. Striking a number of villages in the darkness, tornadoes wrought havoc to many homes, and such reports as were available from agricultural communities, which had been stricken of nearly all means of communication, indicated that 22 persons had been killed.

As it passed over Indiana there were two distinct tornado belts.

**Spanish Green Olive,  
 Beet and Potato Salad**

A salad bears the same relation to your dinner as a hat does to your costume. A piece of half-ripe tomato dropped carelessly on a leaf of lettuce and served as a salad will detract from a dinner no matter how attractive and tasty the remaining courses may be. So many new yet simple salads are being composed constantly that there is no excuse for neglecting this feature of your dinner. Here is one that will appeal:

Cut cold boiled potatoes into cubes and to two cups add one small onion grated, a half pint bottle of green olives cut in rings, a teaspoon of capers, and one pickled beet also cut in rings with small vegetable cutter. Mix lightly, taking care not to break the olive and beet rings, and serve in lettuce hearts with boiled or French dressing.


