Relocating Voting Precinct No. 1 in New Windsor District

WHEREAS, the Board of Election Supervisors of Carroll County, in their judgment believe it is expedient for the precinct of District No. 11, be divided and new boundary lines for the same be made for the purpose of facilitating and expediting the casting of their ballots by the voters thereof.

And it is further ordered that all the territory bound by the Western Maryland Railroad, starting at Medford and running to New Windsor to High Street, up High Street to Church Street, down Church Street to the Western Maryland Railroad to Union Bridge line and bounded by Frederick county, Westminster and Franklin Districts, shall be and constitute the First Precinct of the Eleventh Election District, known as New Windsor District, and that all the territory on the North side of the Western Maryland Railroad from Medford to the Union Bridge District line, (except that part surrounded by High and Church Streets in New Windsor) and bounded by Uniontown, Westminster and Union Bridge District, the usual division, and that part of the town of New Windsor lying East and North of High and Church Streets and running to railroad to the Union Bridge District line, shall be and constitute the Second Precinct of the Eleventh Election District, known as New Windsor District.

St. Paul, Minn., July 26.—Possibility of a contest over the \$900,000 estate of Alexander McKenzie, pioneer political leader of North Dakota, who died recently, was indicated when his will came up before Probate Judge Howard Wheeler, it was learned today.

Under the will the residue of the estate is given to his two daughters, by his first marriage, Mrs. Ann C. McKenzie McDonald of Regard, Quebec, and Mrs. Mary Barbary McKenzie Foster of West Montpel, Quebec, while the three children born to his marriage to Mrs. Elva McKenzie are left but \$50,000 each.

FASTING CURES EPILEPSY

Los Angeles, July 5.—Epilepsy may be cured by fasting, according to theory advanced by Dr. Hugh Conklin, speaking before the 26th annual convention of the American Osteopathic Association now in session here. Epilepsy, according to Dr. Conklin, is caused by improper functioning of certain glands in the bowels. By fasting a patient for 22 days, permitting the patient to take only water, a cure may be effected, he said.

"Many people," added Dr. Conklin, "fast 30 days and are never afflicted by fits again. The longest fast which any patient ever took under my direction lasted 60 days. Out of 37 tests, in which children were used as patients, only two still are affected by the disease. The children all were under the age of 11 years, but we effect cures in older patients in from 50 to 60 percent of the cases we undertake."

GAS FILLS WHOLE VALLEY

Bristow, Okla., Aug. 4.—A giant gas well estimated to be making 30,000,000 feet of gas an hour and spraying oil, is holding up passenger and freight traffic over the St. Louis & San Francisco Railroad between here and Kellyville, and delaying all traffic between Tulsa and Oklahoma City. The track and has filled the valley for more than a mile around with gas. Railroad officials fear the operation of trains would ignite the explosive gas and cause a disastrous fire.
