Partin-Palmer Cars Will Be Shown by S. H. Shadow

The new Partin-Palmer car, made in Detroit, is just now attracting much attention from dealers and others who keep posted in automobile progress. There have been some surprising developments in cars of the \$1,000 class during the past two years, but the limit seems to be reached in this hand-some, roomy, six-passenger, thirty-eight-horse-power automobile for \$975.


Aside from the fact that the 1914 event was a "Six" show, it will go down into history as the first in which electric starting and lighting has become recognized as a standard equipment of the motor car.

Specifications of the new models of Overland cars should be noted by the Willys-Overland Company, of Toledo, Ohio, reveal a line applying four body designs to the same chassis construction. Most of the changes in the 1914 Overland are in the matter of dimensions and added equipment. The body is somewhat larger, with bore and stroke of 4 1/2 and 4 1/2 inches, respectively, and has been improved by adoption of a constant-level splash lubricating system.


