WILSON BELIEVES IN RAISING STANDARD

Secretary of Department of Labor Addresses Letter to Speaker Clark

Washington, D. C., Jan. 23.—After a conference to-day with Commissioner General Lamont, Secretary Wilson, of the Department of Labor, advised Speaker Clark that the problem of Asiatic immigration could be solved by Congress raising the standard of admission so as to include in the list of excluded aliens those persons not able to pass the physical test required of recruits for the United States army.

Concerted Movement in India Secretary Wilson says that a concerted movement exists in India and elsewhere to gain admission to the United States that Canada has legislated even in more drastic manner than is proposed in bills now pending in Congress.

More Problems Coming The secretary wrote that "it would seem to be only a question of probability only a short time before the United States immigration officials will be confronted with problems growing out of increasing immigration of Asiatic laborers from countries other than China, Japan or India."
