 Marietta.—Mr. and Mrs. Michael Gislisling today celebrated their thirty-sixth wedding anniversary at their home.
 Lancaster.—At the Grace Lutheran Church parsonage this morning the Rev. U. E. Haupt united in marriage Miss Edna A. Belbach and Kennedy D. Eckert.

Wilkes-Barre.—Twenty-four women of Edwardsville, who were returning from a sleighing party, were thrown into a snow bank Tuesday night when the sled in which they rode upset in a drift. Mrs. John E. Jones was caught under the sled and severely injured.
 Mahanoy City.—Twenty-two passengers in a Schuylkill railway car were thrown into a panic yesterday near this city when the earth behind them in the roadbed gave way. The car barely escaped going down into

the underground workings.
 Bethlehem.—Carl Moser and his bride of a few days had a narrow escape from asphyxiation in their new home here yesterday. A defective furnace caused the house to become filled with gas.
 Pottsville.—Ex-Sheriff S. Roland Beddal, of Port Carbon, was stricken while in Washington, D. C., and was hurried home. He is in a critical condition.
 Wilkes-Barre.—Miss Rose Adams, aged 18 years, who was to have mar-

ried Adolph Mickalonis at Ashley last night, fled from the house, leaving the bridegroom, the guests and the wedding party waiting for her return. She did not come back, and was found at the home of a relative yesterday and detained on a charge of breach of promise.

MEN ARE NOT GUILTY
