APPROPRIATION OF \$1,750 FOR LIBRARY

Court Directs County Commissioners Under 1913 Acts to Pay For Law Books

In accordance with the acts of 1913, provision for maintenance of the Dauphin county law library during 1914 will be made this year by direct appropriation by the County Commissioners instead of from the fines and forfeitures collected during the year, and in an order filed to-day President Judge Kunkel directs the commissioners to appropriate \$1,750 for the purpose.

Heretofore had the fines and forfeitures have gone toward the support of the court library, but the legislation of 1913 provides for direct appropriation. Accordingly, C. H. Berger, treasurer of the library committee, asked the court to order the payment of \$1,750 which is considered necessary to keep the library going throughout the year.

The library has a balance on hand of \$1,053.59, \$700 of which has practically been charged against the fund by the payment of publications. This leaves in the neighborhood of \$400 available.
