TRAGEDY HEADS THE ORPHEUM THIS WEEK

"Green Beetle" Grips Because of Its Weirddness and Cunning; Rest of Bill Comedy

Tragedy dressed in green and yellow garments makes up the Orpheum headliner, John Willard's "The Green Beetle." Weird, filled with the slinking cunning of the Oriental, the fantasy grips partly because of its weirdness and cunning, partly because of the human interest story wrapped up in the plot. The story of the murder of a man and the drugging of his beautiful wife with its horrible consequences is told in two acts. The couple, while sightseeing in New York's Chinatown, wander into the store of a Chinese merchant, See Yup. The woman purchases a carved green beetle as a souvenir, intending to give it to her daughter on her fifth birthday. Before the pair can leave, however, the woman is drugged and her husband is slily murdered. Act II is a scene in the shop, fifteen years later, when into the store comes the daughter of the woman who was trapped, together with her fiance. On her finger the girl is wearing the green beetle ring found in her dead father's pocket.

Again the trap is set by See Yup; again the tea is drugged, and again See Yup's serva it makes ready to slay the girl's escort. Just as the girl is about to drink the drugged tea her mother, who has been the demented slave of See Yup since the birth of a daughter to the Chinese merchant, suddenly dashes the cup from the girl's hand. The captive recognizes her daughter from the green beetle ring and kills See Yup by scratching the merchant's hand with a poisoned needle concealed in a fan.

One of the most striking things in the fantasy is the singing of the Chinese death song at the end of both the first and second acts by Moy Gow, See Yup's servant. In the first it is sung over the dead husband; in the second over the murderer. As See Yup, Louis Casavant was the embodiment of cunning, treachery and Oriental philosophy, Madge Voe, as the drugged wife, and Frederick R. Seaton, as Moy Gow, did especially creditable work.

Comedy reigns throughout the rest of the bill. Paul Morton and Naomi Glass in "My Lady of the Bungalow" perhaps scored the biggest hit of the evening next to the headliner. Morton is limber and nifty and clever and took especially well with the gentler portion of the audience. Lawton, a comedy juggler, played a drum with a sizzling five tennis balls in a way that made you think a parade was passing the theater door; Charles R. Sweet in the "Burdial" does a bit of tomfoolery that is not displeasing; Hugh Lloy and company do a tight-rope act, the "company" end being a rather pretty little lady in tights who handed Hugh his property.

Whitfield and Ireland in "The Belle of Bingville" got off a wad of old jokes and several new ones; George Hickman and company in "Two Ways to Look" gives the audience a glimpse of stage life from the side. MAX ROBERTSON.
