A COSTLY LOCK OF HAIR Now that the new tariff law is in full operation many amusing incidents and surprises mark its daily workings. A western Congressman who spent the holidays in New York told one story of a case of books—first editions they were, of Dickens and Thackeray—which had been consigned by a London dealer to a New York bookseller, and were held up because the shipment included, in addition to the books, a lock of Charles Dickens' hair. This "hairloom" called for \$70 duty, and the bookseller, who "hated like the Dickens" to pay it, wrote to Washington about it. Articles of antiquity must be 100 years old to enter this country free of duty. Dickens was born in 1812, more than 100 years ago, and it was argued that for this reason the hair could be admitted duty free, even though the lock was cut in later life. The custom House officials maintained, however, that the lock was not yet an antiquity, so the dealer had to pay the regular duty on hair.
