An Appeal Granted in Killifer Case

Cincinnati, Ohio, May 6.—Judge Sessions, of the United States Circuit Court of Appeals, announced yesterday that he had granted an appeal in the Federal Baseball League's case relative to Player Killifer, which was decided against it at Grand Rapids several weeks ago. Judge Sessions said the general basis for the appeal was the claim that the lower court had erred in denying an injunction. It was also announced that the hearing would probably take place in this city some time in the Fall. In deciding the case Judge Sessions in a lengthy opinion denied the application of the Chicago Federal League club for an injunction, on the grounds that the Chicago club did not come into court "with clean hands." The reserve clause, however, was held not valid, but Killifer was allowed to return to the Philadelphia Nationals after being severely scored by Judge Sessions.
