BIGELOW AWARDS ELEVEN CONTRACTS

Two For York County in the List Which Will Be Constructed Under State Aid Plan

Eleven contracts were awarded by State Highway Commissioner Bigelow to State-aid highways in different parts of the State late yesterday. Bids on one contract were held over for further consideration and investigation. On another one the two bids were thrown out by the commissioner, who remarked that the department forces could do the work much cheaper.

The contracts awarded were as follows: In Chester county, East Bradford township, 17,102 feet, asphaltic bituminous macadam (penetration method) or 15,388 feet and one course concrete roadway for 715 feet, to M. Bennett & Sons, Indiana, Pa., for \$52,612.78. The other bidders were: B. F. Richardson, Philadelphia, \$61,211.08; Corcoran Construction Company, West Chester, \$57,562.36; M. & William C. Evans, Ambler, \$64,961.23; R. H. Johnson & Co., Wayne, \$54,366.70; Neff, Horn & Co., Slatington, \$59,828.31.

In Cambria county, East Taylor township and Conemaugh borough, a distance of 9,185 feet, for alternate bids of one course concrete roadway and brick block paving on a concrete foundation, the contract was awarded to Bell, Bockel Co., of Altoona, Pa., at \$46,041.02 for brick. In York county, Stewartstown borough, a distance of 5,270 feet, of asphaltic concrete on a concrete foundation, the contract was awarded to Dwyer & Co., of Philadelphia, the only bidder, at \$28,948.09.

In York county, Hopewell township, a distance of 15,264 feet, of asphaltic bituminous macadam by the penetration method, the contract was awarded to George C. Souder, of Lancaster, Pa., at \$67,048.75. The only other bidder was Dwyer & Co., of Philadelphia, at \$72,854.81.

In Lycoming county, Montgomery borough, a distance of 5,787 feet, of brick block paving, contract was awarded to Busch & Stewart, of Williamsport, Pa., at \$95,466.32. The other bidders were: W. H. Lyons, Sunbury, Pa., \$40,699.53; Monroe Paving Company, Langhorne, Pa., \$39,229.09; E. H. Coryell, Williamsport, Pa., \$36,767.19; G. W. Rockwell, Sunbury, Pa., \$42,016.52.

In Westmoreland county, Hempfield township, Route No. 118, a distance of 325 feet, of telford macadam, the commissioner threw out the bids of James H. Offutt, of Greensburg, Pa., at \$3,712.77, and of Ridge Bros. Co., of Pittsburgh, at \$4,890.70, remarking that the State Highway Department could do the work cheaper.
