

There is no use trying to hide the true state of affairs. The public sees the true condition of the game even more quickly than the players. It has been the players, aided and abetted by club owners and their agents, who have brought baseball to the condition prevailing at the present time.

Minor leagues will suffer the same as the majors," said Comisky. "It is all due to contract jumping and the demoralized conditions of the players."
