Historic Flag Floats at Mechanicsburg on Fourth

 Mechanicsburg, Pa., July 6.—Of all flag flung to the breeze on Independence Day in this place probably the most interesting was the one on the front of the residence of George Duey, South Market street. Faded in color but proudly doing duty, it looked as though it had seen active service. And it had. In the battle of Antietam it was borne by the boys in the First Regiment State Troops, Company F. Colonel Harry McCormick, of Harrisburg, had command of the regiment

and Captain Thomas Kerr, of Mechanicsburg, the company.
 The flag is a large, handsome one of silk, now faded, and gold fringe, now tarnished, but well preserved. It was made and presented by ladies in Mechanicsburg. At the close of the war the flag was given into the keeping of George Duey, a member of the company, who has it in his possession and displays it on national holidays.

 Lebanon, Pa., July 6.—Comparing the chasing of greased pigs, roosters and other fowls and animals with the barbarous bull fighting of the Spaniards, Milton A. Blazier, president and general agent of the Lebanon County Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, has placed a ban on that kind of sport at summer outings and picnics. When the order was issued yesterday there was consternation in the ranks of Sunday school superin-

tendents and their Sunday school members, as that form of sport has been practiced very extensively at picnics thus far held in this region. Mr. Blazier insists, however, that the order shall be enforced and threatens prosecution for violations.
