## Trading in First Hour Exceeds 200,000 Shares

### Official Advices From Abroad Were of Most Pessimistic Character; Bonds Weak

New York, July 27.—Trading in the first hour today was in excess of 200,000 shares, of which a considerable part represented urgent selling offerings. There was some diminution of activity toward the end of the first hour, but in large volume was seized upon as a fresh reason to sell. Prices went below those of the first and activity in all parts of the list was resumed. Official and other advices from abroad were of the most pessimistic character, including the reported closing of the exchanges at Brussels. London, Paris and Berlin continued their liquidation processes here long after their own markets. The bond market was weak.
