Bigelow Ruling Has Been a Help to People Living in Many Sections of the State

The use of traction engines on the highways of Pennsylvania is increasing to a great extent since the rules governing the operation of them were modified by State Highway Commissioner Bigelow.

FACTS ABOUT PUMPKINS

In the current issue of Farm and Fireside appears an article entitled "In Defense of the Pumpkin." The following facts about pumpkins and the uses to which they can be put are taken from the article:

"Pumpkins are largely composed of water, and so some agricultural writers have declared that pumpkins have but little value as stock food. The same objection might be made against grass, which everybody knows is the best food in the world for farm live stock."

"Horses are fond of pumpkins and will eat them without any cutting up. They are healthful for horses that are kept on dry feed when fed in moderation."

"Hogs will eat pumpkins, and they are cheap and wholesome feed for them when fed in connection with grain. We cut the pumpkins into small pieces which can be eaten easily, and put them into the trough instead of breaking them up and throwing them into the pen. We find it pays well for the time spent in cutting. The pumpkins are fed in the morning when appetites are keen, and before the grain is given."
