Germans Defeat Forces of French, According to Wireless Dispatches

Berlin, Aug. 24 (By wireless to Associated Press from Nauen, Germany, via Sayville, Long Island).—Official announcement was made here to-day that the German army commanded by Grand Duke Albrecht of Wurtemberg, has defeated a French army at Neufchatel.

It captured many guns, flags and prisoners, including several generals. German armies under Rupprecht, Crown Prince Wilhelm and Grand Duke Albrecht are vigorously pursuing the French.

The army under Rupprecht, captured 150 guns at Lunville, in the French department of Meurthe and Moselle.

The army commanded by the Crown Prince pursued the French beyond Longwy.

The Germans are west of the river Meuse and advancing against Maubege. They have defeated an English brigade of cavalry.

Railroad Company Complains in Asking Appeal From Public Service Ruling

At a brief session of motion picture court, Judge W. N. Selbert, Perry county, specially presiding, fixed September 8 at 10 o'clock for hearing of the appeal of the Kane and Elk Railroad

Public Service Commission in granting the Gaffney and James City Railroad Company the right to cross the appellants' right of way.

In complaining the appellants ask that the court's decree serve as a supersedeas and that the defendant company be prohibited from continuing with the laying of the tracks until the case is finally disposed of.

The Kane and Elk company say that not only did the defendants interfere with the former's operation, but tore up its tracks and interfered with the workmen even to forcing the firemen of a locomotive from his post and overpowering the engineer.
